Exposition by Rev. Canon Abraham Lubega Kisakye

On Sunday, 4th May 2025, St. Stephen's Church of Uganda Luzira Archdeaconry Headquarters hosted a spirit-filled mini convention under the powerful ministration of Rev. Canon Abraham Lubega Kisakye.

Drawing from the book of Job, Rev. Canon Kisakye preached a profound message on faith, suffering, and righteousness. He highlighted how Job's endurance and integrity in adversity demonstrate that not all suffering is a result of sin, but sometimes a divine test meant to refine us and bear witness to God's sovereignty. Referencing Job 8:20, he reminded believers that "God does not reject a blameless person or strengthen the hands of evildoers."
