Some benefits of harvesting according to the New Testament :

Spiritual Fruitfulness: Harvesting well can be seen as a metaphor for bearing spiritual fruit, which is a result of abiding in Christ (John 15:4-5). "I am the vine; you are the branches. If you remain in me and I in you, you will bear much fruit" (John 15:5).

Reward for Labour: Harvesting well implies reaping the rewards of one's Labour, which can be seen as a principle for Christians in their work and ministry (1 Corinthians 3:6-8). The one who sows and the one who reaps will celebrate together" (John 4:36).

Provision for Others: Harvesting well can provide for others, including the poor and those in need, which is a key principle of Christian giving and generosity (2 Corinthians 9:6-11).

Gratitude and Thanksgiving: Harvesting well can be a reason for gratitude and thanksgiving, recognizing God's provision and blessings in our lives (1 Thessalonians 5:18, 1 Timothy 4:4-5).

Sowing and Reaping: The principle of sowing and reaping is a key theme in the New Testament, emphasizing the importance of sowing good seeds (deeds, actions, and attitudes) and reaping a good harvest (Galatians 6:7-9).

Eternal Rewards: Harvesting well can also be seen as a metaphor for storing up eternal rewards, which are incorruptible and enduring (Matthew 6:19-21).

The Bible still gives these hints on harvesting which matter a lot in every Christian life;

Matthew 9:37-38: "The harvest is plentiful, but the workers are few. Ask the Lord of the harvest, therefore, to send out workers into his harvest field."

John 4:35-36: "Don't you have a saying, 'It's still four months until harvest'? I tell you, open your eyes and look at the fields! They are ripe for harvest."

Galatians 6:7-9: "Do not be deceived: God cannot be mocked. A man reaps what he sows. Whoever sows to please their flesh, from the flesh will reap destruction; whoever sows to please the Spirit, from the Spirit will reap eternal life."

2 Corinthians 9:6-7: "Whoever sows sparingly will also reap sparingly, and whoever sows generously will also reap generously. Each of you should give what you have decided in your heart to give, not reluctantly or under compulsion, for God loves a cheerful giver."

With such principles, Christians can cultivate a deeper appreciation for the importance of harvesting well and living a life that honours God.

Gratitude and Thanksgiving: "Give thanks to the Lord, for he is good; his love endures forever!" (Mark 12:30, referencing Psalm 107:1).

Eternal Rewards: "Store up for yourselves treasures in heaven, where moths and vermin do not destroy, and where thieves do not break in and steal" (Matthew 6:20).

Sowing and Reaping: "Do not be deceived: God cannot be mocked. A man reaps what he sows" (Galatians 6:7-8).

Harvesting biblically, as referenced in the Old Testament, brings numerous benefits including;

Spiritual growth and thanksgiving: Harvesting acknowledges God's provision and sovereignty, fostering spiritual growth and thanksgiving.

Provision for the poor and strangers: Leaving gleanings in the field for the poor and strangers demonstrates compassion and care for those in need (Leviticus 19:9, 23:22).

Blessings and abundance: Obeying God's commands regarding harvesting leads to blessings and abundance (Deuteronomy 28:38, Psalm 67:6).

Joy and celebration: Harvesting is a time of joy and celebration, reflecting the Israelites' dependence on God for their crops (Isaiah 9:3, Psalm 126:5-6).

Recognition of God's sovereignty: Harvesting acknowledges God's control over the land and its produce, recognizing His power and provision (Jeremiah 5:24, Amos 4:7).

Physical sustenance: Harvesting provides physical sustenance and nourishment for individuals and communities (Genesis 8:22, Psalm 107:37-38).

Symbolism of spiritual harvest: The physical harvest serves as a symbol for spiritual harvest, representing the gathering of souls and the fruit of righteousness (Isaiah 27:6, Matt. 9:37-38).
